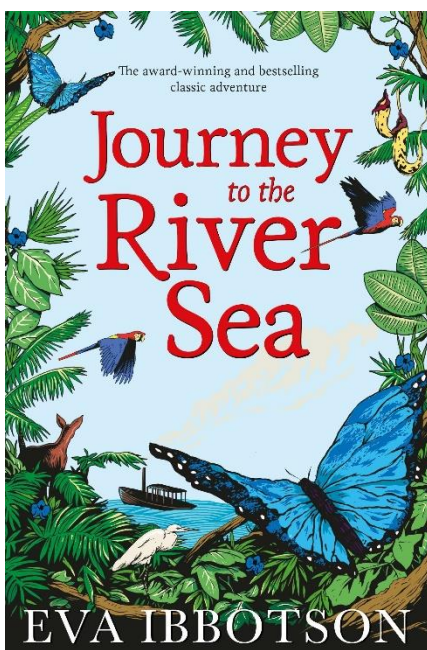
Meet CCH class author...

Eva Ibbotson

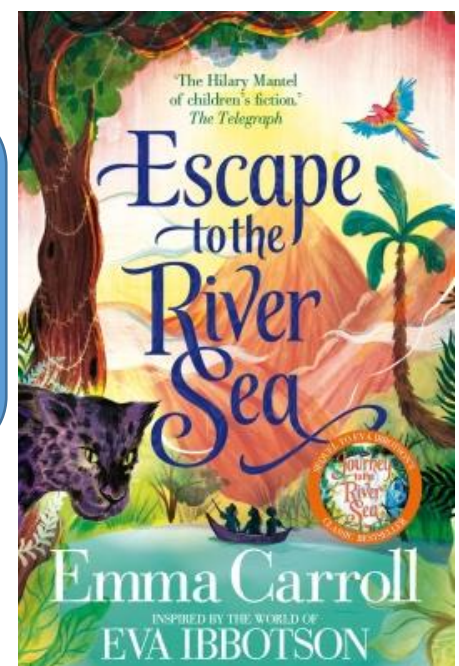
...and a cameo from Emma Carroll!

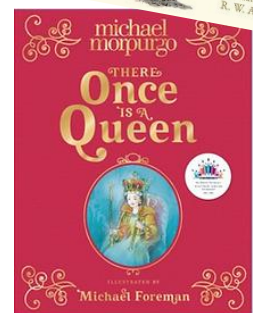
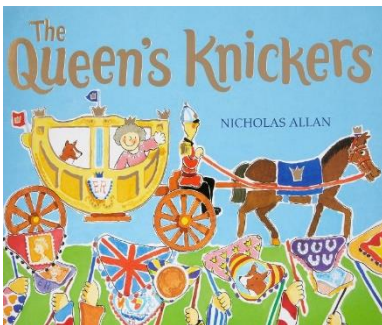
Inspired by Eva Ibbotson's famous novel, author Emma Carroll has written 'Escape to the River Sea' which is being published in June!



THE QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE

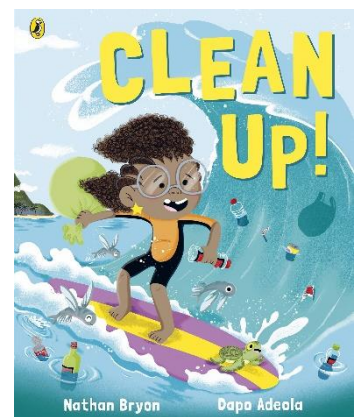
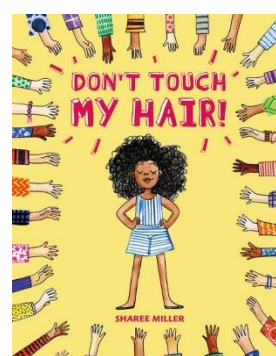
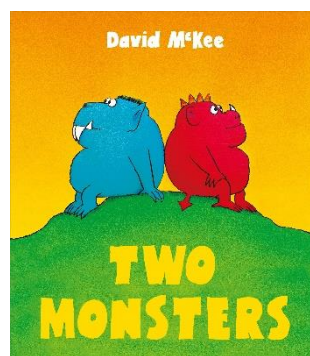
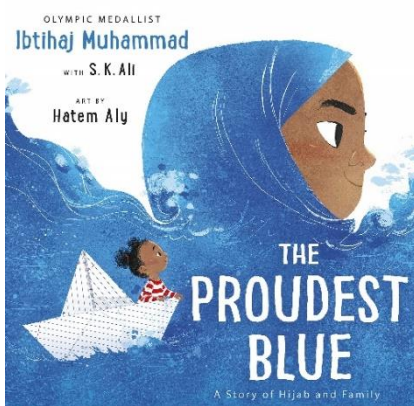

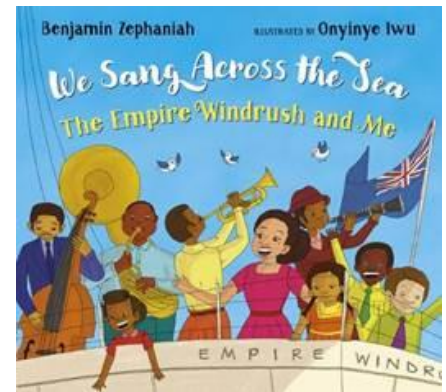
Reading Round-up!

For ages 4-5 +

We Sang Across the Sea by Benjamin Zephaniah

For ages 6-8 +

The Comet by Joe Todd-Stanton

When Nyla and her dad move to the city from the seaside, she can only see seven stars. She can remember thousands from the seaside! One day, Nyla spots a comet in the sky and creates something new and beautiful to transform their new home into something magical.



For ages 9-11 +

All of Oliver Jeffers Class, recommends 'The Book with No Pictures' by B. J. Novak:

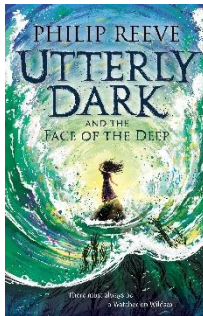
We recommend this because it is very funny and it makes grown-ups say funny things! It will really make you laugh!

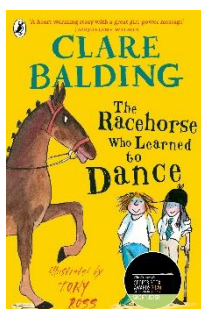
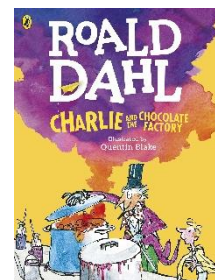


Lola H, Berlie Doherty Class, recommends 'Utterly Dark and the Face of the Deep' by Philip Reeve:
